SOUTHEAST ASIA SHORTLIST ANNOUNCED FOR GLOBAL FUTURE CITIES COMPETITION

SINGAPORE – 9 JULY - An idea to address the problem of trade and tourism imbalance in Bali, extinction of indigenous identities in Kuala Lumpur and the lack of affordable housing in Manila are among those shortlisted for Southeast Asia in a global competition run by RICS (the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors).

These are just some of the entries showcased at the **Cities for Our Future showcase-cumpanel session**, which will take place at <u>2:15pm – 3:15pm on 10 July at the City Innovators</u> <u>Area</u>, as a co-located event at the World Cities Summit 2018.

The full shortlist of entries announced:

- Construction of an innovation hub in the North West of Bali to help address the trade and tourism imbalance proposed by **Alistair Brook** from Ireland.
- New vernacular housing geared towards preserving cultural identities in Kuala Lumpur proposed by **Hasseef Rafiei** from the United Kingdom.
- Affordable, expandable, modular, bamboo housing in Manila to address the housing crisis proposed by **Earl Patrick Forlales** from the Philippines.
- An accessible and affordable banking app for the people of the Philippines proposed by **Junver Arcayna** from the Philippines.
- Reinforced concrete tiles to be introduced in Singapore that convert waste heat energy to useful electrical energy proposed by **John Laboguin** from the Philippines.

With three million people moving to cities every week, the growth of the urban population is one of the biggest challenges facing society today. This rapid expansion is putting ever more strain on urban infrastructure and services. Many city dwellers live in slums or poor quality housing; many put up with poor air quality and inadequate transport links.

The *Cities for our Future* competition, run by RICS in partnership with the United Kingdom National Commission for UNESCO and the Association of Commonwealth Universities, called upon young people to come up with new ideas to help tackle the most pressing problems affecting cities in Southeast Asia and around the world. The overall winner of the competition will receive a prize of approximately S\$90,000 (or £50,000).

Will Myles, Head Judge the Southeast Asia region and RICS Regional Managing Director, commented: "The entries are all very exciting. The ideas are original and showcase some of the best examples of forward-thinking from young people we've ever seen.

It is estimated that around 100 million people will move from the countryside to cities between 2015 and 2030 in Southeast Asia. The entrants have all looked to address this rapid urbanisation in their own way and I wish them all the best of luck in realising their visions of futuristic cities."
